


#### Library looms large

We have had a fantastic number of books borrowed, clubs running every day, special events marked and celebrated with workshops, author visits and a great team of librarians to support our amazing librarian Mrs Kingsland. I would like to also take this opportunity to thank Mrs Williamson, our literacy lead for guiding the whole process. As an indication of the impact of the library for our pupils this is a short section from one of our Year 7 librarians' application form to become a librarian:

Firstly, I would like to say that I love spending time in the Library and I love to help out with putting books away, being a librarian, being here for many activities such as world book day, book fairs etc, and also being able to decorate the library for many amazing events in the course of history or even just to celebrate!

Below is a snapshot of what has occurred this year:

#### **Track and Pool Success**

Two of our Sixth Form athletes have enjoyed promising summers on the track. Georgie Kyte has been selected to run for Kent in a national competition in Birmingham. She has excelled in the 400 metre hurdles this summer and recently smashed a second off her personal best in the county championships. Abi Hawkes did very well in the 800 metres at the same event.

Year 8 student, Ashton Platts, continues to perform well in the swimming pool. He competed at The British Para-Swimming Championships in Coventry and swam in seven events. He was swimming against older competitors and despite this, he has qualified for the summer national event in the 200 metre individual medley.

Some of our younger footballers have finished the season in style. Year 8 student, Lucy Stringer, capped an incredible season for her club by being selected for the Kent Schools U14 squad after a trial during June. Cody Beale and Charlie Betts, also in Year 8, represented Canterbury District in a national final against Salford in Manchester this summer. Despite losing 3-0, this is a great effort by both boys.

Year 9 student, Lola Sanderson has been selected to represent an England u15 touch rugby side in an international tournament in France in August. Lola represents Canterbury Rugby Club and Invicta Touch.

#### **Communities Day**


This year our Communities Week evolved into a Communities Day with all staff and pupils off timetable for the day to give back to others or the environment.

Activities included litter picking sites around Canterbury; planting hedges at the Academy; bag packing at ASDA; collecting and delivering donations for Catching Lives and Canterbury Food Bank; making snacks for Blue Light Workers; holding intergenerational conversations; painting fences onsite; making artwork and bags for Dottie's Little Hog Hospital to sell to raise funds for the charity; making books to share with nursery and primary children; making friendship bracelets for guests attending our performing arts showcase.

Children from the whole school worked together to make a difference to others and improve our local environment for the benefit of the wider community.

- Our Asda bag packing volunteers raised £152 for Catching Lives today and delivered items directly to the charity this afternoon.
- More than 250 children litter picked across Canterbury, going to Broad Oak, Blean, Spring Lane, Military Road and around the school.
- Local residents received gifts of 30 hugs in a mug on their doorsteps.
- Children onsite painted fences, planted hedges, wrote and read books to our primary pupils and nursery children.
- Children delivered homemade snacks and meals to the police station, fire station and hospital.
- Year 1 and 2 from CPS watched Academy and primary performers and received friendship bracelets made by academy pupils.
- As a community we amassed more than 4000 hours of giving back today.


